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Puerto Vallarta **“Where Mexico comes to life”**

With an average temperature of 27 ° C and a climate similar to Hawaii, Puerto Vallarta is located at the second largest bay in Latin America, the Banderas Bay.

With about 42 km of beach, you will find an option that meets your tastes, from fine sand beaches with crystalline water, quiet beaches with underwater rock formations perfect for scuba diving, to very shallow beaches ideal for surfing.

Within the city you can walk through its cobblesto-

ne streets and visit local shops, where you can buy typical beach clothes of the region and savor the exquisite dishes that characterize the kitchen from Jalisco, and admire, from a multitude of open air restaurants the incredible sunsets that gave international fame to Puerto Vallarta.

Eating out.

The culinary scene in Puerto Vallarta is so amazingly diverse and extensive that you would have to visit a different restaurant every day for three years to try them all! Naturally, Puerto Vallarta is a great place to discover the impressive variety of Mexican dishes as well as its succulent seafood, popular kitchens merge as the Mediterranean, Eastern and gourmet French, the list is endless. Whichever your whim or budget were, there is an atmosphere and location that will satisfy you with stellar views that often accompany the memorable meals

Nightlife

As one would expect in a tourist destination of the size of Puerto Vallarta, you will find a wide range of concepts in which to have fun depending on your preferences, from small canteens with traditional Mexican live music to lounges with the latest electronic music going through singin'bars and bars with live rock.

The most popular options include: Cristhine, an institution in the nightlife of Puerto Vallarta, Carlos O'Brian's, with its particular style of entertainment, De Santo's Bar, an attractive minimalist lounge and The Zoo Bar, the twin concept bearing the same name in London.

Outdoor activities

If you are of those who enjoy the sea, Puerto Vallarta offers many activities there, such as surfing, travel by kayak, swimming with whales, diving and fishing among others, one of the more advisable options is to visit the Marietas islands, located 41 km to the north of the Banderas Bay, where a one-day tour will take you to this biosphere reserve with over 40 species of migratory birds and marine life surrounded by water, among which we can see the presence of giant stingrays, turtles and in winter, whales.

For land-based activities, you can do from a hike to observe more than 150 species of birds to a tour in a two-seater boogie, passing through many modalities of ecotourism like abseiling, rope descent, survival expeditions and the quieter ones such as jeep safaris.

Tequila route

Perhaps the word that most identifies Mexico in the world is the one that it is used to designate this liquor for more than 400 years in this village, that carries the same name and was recently listed as one of the 23 magic villages of Mexico as well in 2006 was qualified as world heritage by the UNESCO. Here you will find much more than distilleries; you will be amazed by seeing the agave fields that seem to be endless under the protection of the majestic Tequila volcano, visiting the Original Tequila Houses and even collect your own opal in Magdalena. While there it is not a very short trip, it is worth every second that you spend in that region.
